Austria

- Austria covers an area of 83 879 km² of which almost 80% is rural.
- Of the total area, 32% is agricultural land while forests cover 44 %.
- The total population is 8.4 million of which 65 % live in rural areas.
- 87% of farm holdings are located in mountain areas
- Total employment 4.2 million persons






- Land take is among the main challenges.
- Rural depopulation is an increasing problem in Austria and regions are more and more facing the negative effects of this development.








Main Challenges: Land take & rural depopulation umweltbundesamt[®]
